THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

When entering Reconciliation Room, Father will greet you.

Together, you and Father make the sign of the cross and then you say:

Bless me Father for I have sinned

This is my first Confession

(After your first Confession, instead of saying "this is my first confession" you will tell father how long it has been since you last confessed your sins to a priest)

These are my sins – (tell Father your sins)

Confess all your sins to the priest. If you are unsure what to say, ask Father for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words:

"I am sorry for these and all my sins."

Father will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. After you have received your penance, pray an Act of Contrition, expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to sin no more.

My God,

I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy.

The priest will extend his hands over your head and pronounce the words of absolution. You respond, "Amen."

You then return to the body of the church and reverently offer your penance, and reflect on this experience of God's mercy.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
